- You then need to finish with a conclusion that summarises your opinion, making it really clear.
- Sources given in the exam paper and also your own knowledge to explain your points as far as possible, including key terms, too.

Evaluate

Evaluate means weigh up the advantages and disadvantages of something.

- You should use discussion connectives, going back and fore between the upsides and downsides of the options.
- You don't usually need to add a conclusion at the end of these
- READ the question carefully. Sometimes it only wants you to talk about ONE strategy, so you will need to elaborate in more detail to get full marks
- elaborate your points fully! Use your elaborating words 'this means, therefore, as a result, so, because'
- 5. Make sure you refer to information from the sources given in the exam paper and also your own knowledge to explain your points as far as possible, including key terms, too.

Explain

- You must use explaining/elaborating words e.g this means, therefore, as a result, so, because etc
- . You should extend every point you make as far as possible to explain in detail by using these explaining words
- 3. You should include key terms wherever possible
- Sometimes, an explain question may say 'include a diagram if you wish', or 'you may include a diagram' ... translation... DRAW A DIAGRAM
